Earthpledge.net is a site devoted to promoting the advancement of worldcentric consciousness. The mass movement of this global awareness can trace its origin to the earlier photographs taken of our planet. (The one featured on the Earth Flag was taken in 1972) Because of the growing momentum of this coherent and more encompassing perspective, it is absurd to think that within a hundred years or even fifty years from now we will still be living with our current imbalanced world order of ecological crisis and anarchy between nuclear armed nation states. It is more likely we will begin learning to live together as one united people or our species will enter a new dark age to become decimated by world wars and environmental catastrophe. If we want a sustainable and livable future, we must continue working towards a united world for ourselves and the generations that proceed us.

Everyone knows that war and peace are being waged in our world today. Violence and non-violence are two aspects of the same human nature. Knowing when to choose one or the other has always been the dilemma facing us. Most humans want peace but we don't always agree on the means that will get us there.

War and peace may be two sides of the same coin yet not everyone is content with this reality. The United Nations was created by an international coalition who hoped to have an institution in place that could help prevent a third world war through peaceful means. On the other side we have the massive military powers of the world preparing for the next great battle of Earth and resent any effort by those seeking to curtail their autonomous power.

But the arrows available in the left talon represent our willingness to defend ourselves and those we love by forceful means if necessary.

Martin Luther King Jr. maintained commitment to nonviolence in the Civil Rights Movement even though his survival was protected at times by body guards and the National Guard who were mobilized to back up the cause with the presence of physical force.

On the other side, if someone takes a position of absolute militarism, they will rely on cooler heads to prevail as they did during the Cuban Missile Crisis in order to prevent a preemptive strike on the island Communists that very likely would have triggered a nuclear holocaust. A fine balance is required between the more masculine, aggressive, active power and the more feminine receptive, passive power.

Discovering this balance will put us on the right path to peace and in alignment with our greatest potential. Only then will we move closer to the ever more visible destination of a world at peace and a united humanity where liberty and justice may finally ring true for all.
